The Section of Benign Hematology, within the Division of Hematology Oncology, in the Department of Medicine, at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (UPMC) and the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine is seeking an exceptional candidate who is looking for full time academic practice in hematology. The position involves outpatient and inpatient care at UPMC involving a portfolio focused on Benign Hematology, including consultation on complex hemostasis and thrombosis in the setting of advanced surgeries, organ transplantation, and high-risk maternal fetal medicine. Areas of academic interest that fit particularly well with current goals include, but are not limited to sickle cell disease and hemoglobinopathies, thrombosis and malignancy, bleeding and thrombosis in women, and platelet disorders with a focus on inherited bleeding disorders and thrombophilia. The candidate will be joining a group with a long history of excellence across all areas of Hematology. The ideal candidate should demonstrate excellence in patient care and have an interest in working in an academic environment with exceptional opportunities for clinical practice, teaching and research. Opportunities for interdisciplinary and translational research collaboration and teaching at all levels of medical education are available. Applicants who have been successful in obtaining peer-reviewed funding are particularly encouraged to apply. Candidates must be ABIM eligible or certified in Hematology. The faculty member will be expected to participate in the teaching and training of Hematology and Oncology fellows, residents, and medical students, as well as contribute to the Division's annual Scientific Conferences. The Division of Hematology and Oncology has a fellowship program with a strong record of training fellows who have gone on to full-time academic positions, as well as leadership positions in Biotechnology companies. The Section of Benign Hematology also has a T32 grant to foster training in Benign Hematology. Clinical activities will include: attending on the hematology consultation service, the outpatient non-malignant hematology clinic at UPMC and in the Federally Funded Hemophilia Center of Western Pennsylvania, which has access to multiple clinical resources as well as a vast array of diagnostic tools & cutting-edge laboratory studies. Academic rank and salary will be commensurate with level of experience. Early career and entry level candidates with clinical interests in thrombosis and hemostasis are particularly encouraged to apply.
