

Abstract Submission Guidelines

Abstract Submission opens on January 22, 2018

Abstract Submission deadline is February 26, 2018

Each scholar will submit an Abstract for the Annual Meeting.

Abstracts are **required** for ALL PRIDE scholars participating in the PRIDE Annual Meeting, whether you are planning to be a grant reviewer, submitting a grant proposal for reviews, or submitting an abstract for oral or poster presentation. Your abstract should focus on your PRIDE-related work.

Abstracts will be used by the Program Committee to organize the presentations, and also will be posted on the secure Annual Meeting website. This provides a unique opportunity for your peers and PRIDE faculty to review and discuss your research with you.

Abstract format

1. The final version of your Abstract file should be a PDF document. You may use your preferred word processor to generate this file
2. Use 11-point Arial font with 1-inch margins
3. Do not right-justify
4. First line: Abstract Title (bold font)
5. Second line: Authors (bold font)
 - a. Presenter (PRIDE scholar) should be first author
 - b. Additional authors (including Mentor(s)) are optional
6. Abstract Text (250-word limit, not including title and authors)
 - a. Should describe the work you will present in the meeting
 - b. Should not contain references
 - c. Should provide the following information
 - i. Background / Purpose (1-3 sentences)
 - ii. Methods: (1-3 sentences)
 - iii. Results: Provide characteristics of the sample, results, or hypotheses (if results not yet available), or novel applications (1-3 sentences)
 - iv. Significance: Describe the significance and implications of your findings, how will your research advance the field (1-3 sentences)
7. Abstracts should be brief and succinct.
