Under the direction of two senior scientists, Carol Horowitz MD MP and Lynne Richardson MD, Institute faculty conduct paradigm-shifting research to engage at-risk populations, facilitate access to life-changing resources, and inform life-saving interventions. The Institute is one of the leads for the Mount Sinai NIH FIRST Program, which is designed to foster sustainable institutional culture change, promote institutional inclusive excellence by hiring a diverse cohort of new faculty in a cluster model, and support faculty development, mentoring, sponsorship and promotion.

The FIRST Program offers an extensive faculty development program and mentorship from renowned senior faculty with well-established track records of interdisciplinary research collaborations, obtaining federal and private foundation funding, and fostering the careers of diverse scientists. Successful candidates will enter at the Assistant Professor (tenure track) level and will be provided with salary support for themselves and their staff as well as other research expenses while they develop and submit an R01 or equivalent application within 2-3 years of hire.
